THE SMOKELESS STOVE

In rural Guatemala, cooking indoors over an open flame is exceedingly common. Women and children are especially prone to lung disease, eye irritation, and headaches. Habitat's smokeless stoves use an innovative design that redirects all the smoke through a pipe and outside the house. Instead of kneeling, cooks enjoy standing, using three burners that are out of kids' reach.

THE SANITARY LATRINE



Especially in the countryside of Guatemala, there is a need for improved sanitation. In rural areas, latrines are often poorly constructed or in a dysfunctional state. Habitat Guatemala has introduced a sanitary latrine model that safely treats waste. Homeowners quickly note that it doesn't stink like the old one did. It has an exhaust tube to keep the smell - and diseases - at bay.

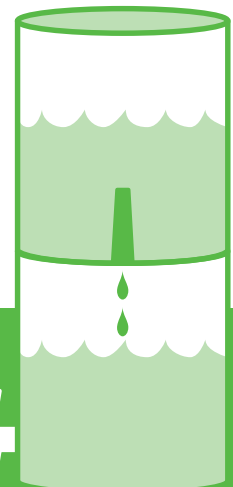

In Guatemala, safe drinking water can't be found by turning on the faucet. To be potable, the water must be treated. The most accessible, cost-effective, and efficient way to treat water is to send it through a filter. Habitat Guatemala's product features a low-maintenance clay filter that takes contaminated water and makes it drinkable. We believe everyone should have clean water, and this filter makes it possible, anywhere, any time.
